and written numerous books based on his experiences. You can find his collection of local fossils in the Schoelkopf Geological Museum in Niagara Falls.

For the youngest paleontologist, PaleoJoe has written **Hidden Dinosaurs**

(Mackinac Island Press, Traverse City, 2006, \$18.95). This picture book is packed full of information and can be used in many ways. It can be read as a story with simple, poetic, and informative text. It can be used to

discover many interesting facts about dinosaurs in the Dino Data boxes on every other page. Or it can be used to practice looking carefully (just like a paleontologist) to search the illustrations for hidden icons.

In it we learn about kinds of dinosaurs, where they lived, what they ate, how they lived, how and where the fossils were discovered, and the science of paleontology. This book is fun and informative on so many levels.




PaleoJoe has written four others
